- 1. "The state shall endeavour to foster respect for international law and treaty obligations in the dealings of organised people with one another". Evaluate this statement referring to the treaty making power of parliament in the UK, USA and India for giving effect to international agreements.
- 2. "The Division and Distribution of power is an essential feature of a federation". Do you agree? substantiate your answer referring to how far distribution of legislative power makes an impact on the cooperative federalism and competitive Federalism and cite relevant constitutional Articles of the USA and Indian constitution.
- 3. "The proclamation of emergency creates problems to the constitution and adversely affects the rights of the people at all level". Do you agree? Evaluate this statement referring to the grounds for declaration of emergency and constitutional safeguards against emergency in the United States of America and India.
- 4. Critically analyse the Parliamentary Supremacy in U.K. and Compare it with the powers of Indian Parliament.
- 5. "Internal threats to national security have assumed centre stage in the debates as Indian security". Substantiate referring to the role of federal constitutions in sharing the responsibilities for maintenance of law and order.
